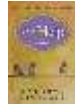

Did You Know? Library Resources

Each month we highlight a different library resource. This resource is either in print form, a service, or in an online format. This month is on **Transparent Languages**.

Transparent Languages is an online language learning program that allows you access to over 100 foreign languages with your library card! It's user-friendly program. A select few (6) languages designed as immersion courses using Kidspeak. Already learning a language? This is good practice too. There are 2 formats available – on the computer and a mobile app.

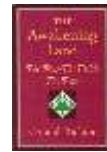

As participants advance they can check out additional resources under the Resources tab or even check to see what vocabulary words one has already learned. Participants are able to constantly learn what they learned by practicing their language in a wide array of skills in various formats (listening, reading, speaking and writing).
