This month we are highlighting our online resources. We have a new resource that we will be launching this summer. We are excited to announce that we are now using Beanstack!



Beanstack by Zoobean is a website and a FREE app for <u>iOS</u> and <u>Android</u>. It's a fun way to log books, complete activities and earn badges. We have challenges for all ages already planned.

Beanstack will automatically direct you to the appropriate activities based on your age. There are three age groups: kids, teens, and adults. If you wish to be contacted about prizes and drawings, please include an email address or telephone number as part of your Beanstack profile.
