Hotspots:

Internet slow at home? We've got a solution for you! We have 10! Yes, 10 hotspots that are available for checkout. To get one of these hotspots: you must be a current InfoSoup Library Card holder in good standing, be 18 years or older, and a permanent resident for 60 days (I.D. address must be current home address). Hotspots can be checked out for 7 days at a time (sorry only 1 per family/ household). These hotspots are only available at our location, meaning they are not sent to other libraries' patrons. Call or stop by the Algoma Public Library to inquire about one today!



Libby:

Libby is our app that allows you to checkout and borrow eBooks, magazines, and more from your local library. The app is offered for both Apple and Android users. You even have an opportunity to choose your checkout times for eBooks and eaudiobooks. Options are 7, 14 or 21 days. The app is very user friendly. Plus there are NO LATE FINES, because your items are automatically returned at the end of your loan period. There are also items for children, teens and adults both fiction and non-fiction.

Hoopla:

Similar to Libby, this app allows users to read eBooks, eAudiobooks, watch movies and listen to music. Item loan periods are 7 days for Music, EAudiobooks and eBooks are 21 days. Through BingePass patrons can access Hoopla Magazines, The Great Courses Video Library Collection and Curiosity Stream for 7 days each. Items are also returned automatically at the end of your loan period so NO FINES!



Mobile Printing:

Need documents printed? We now have mobile printing available using the website (https://tbs.eprintit.com/portal/#/ppl/upload/ALG) or the app eprint. The app is compatible with both Apple and Android devices. Cost of printing is \$1.00 for color and 25¢ for black & white. We can accept up to 100 MB per print job.
